

## **2. INTRODUCTION**

This product is a professional, personal proof collector and a movable device. Built-in high quality pinhole camera, which enables 3 types of schedule record mode: Manual, Continuous, and Motion Detection. Enables picture storage to built-in Flash Memory. Furnished with fixed bracket that makes it perfect for simple installation under many different occasions:

- Applications using the bracket, such as front door, room door, garage door and so on.
- Applications without using bracket, such as a glass cabinet, on the table, inside the car and so on.

Power supported by 4 AA batteries or plug-in power adaptor (DC12V). It is suggested to use the plug-in adaptor for usage under long extended period of time or use 4 AA batteries under short period of time, and when there is no power socket. The LED indicator allows the user to easily distinguish the current battery status (LED indicator lit, indicates that the power is sufficient and when the LED indicator unlit, indicates that there are insufficient power).

Simple user-friendly interface enables easy recording setups (Record Mode, Record Frames per Second, Motion Detection Sensitivity, and etc.). For more details, please refer to the section on "Operation Description" and "Function Setup Description".

## **3. FEATURES**

- The device is extremely portable with built-in Hi-resolution camera.
- Simultaneous monitoring and recording.
- Automatic image control functions.
- Functions supported: Auto Electronic shutter (AES), Auto White Balance (AWB), and Auto Gain Control (AGC).
- Video capture device record images in built-in Flash memory (capacity differs depending model type).
- Video capture device records images in built-in flash memory (capacity differs depending on model type). Recording auto resumes after power loss and back.
- Supports three recording modes: Manual, Schedule Continuous, and Schedule Motion Detection.
- Supports both NTSC and PAL system.
- Two types of resolution (selectable): 320x240 and 640x480.
- Selectable compression image qualities and frame rate.
- Motion detection with adjustable sensitivity level.
- Supports flexible playback mode: Normal Playback, Rewind, Fast Forward, and Step Playback.
- Supports DC12V or 4xAA batteries (use anywhere, camera can be powered by battery, so power outlet is unnecessary).

## 6. NAME and FUNCTION of EACH PART

### 6.1 Front Pannel



#### (1) Function Switch

#### • NTSC<->PAL

The two most common video standards used are NTSC and PAL. NTSC is the video system or standard commonly used in North America, Taiwan, Japan, Korea, and South America. PAL is the predominant video system or standard mostly used in China, Hong Kong, Europe, and India.

Please select and switch to the system that best suits your location. Take note that this setup is only effective when it is setup before power-on.

#### • Full Stop<->Overwrite

Select whether to overwrite the recorded memories or to stop recording when memory is full. One may select "**Overwrite**", the memory will be overwritten starting with the oldest data first.

Selecting "Full Stop", when the memory system is full, it switches from record mode to stop mode, and the LED indicator on the front panel will start flashing. Take note that this setup is only effective when it is setup before power-on.

#### (2) Video Output Jack

To enable monitoring functions, connect one terminal to the video out jack and the other terminal to the monitor (TV).

#### (3) **Po wer Switch**

Select "On" to switch on the device, and "Off" to switch off the device.

When power-loss occurs during recording, error may occur. To switch off the power correctly, please refer to "6.3 Record Mode".

#### (4) **Power Source Jack.**

#### (5) LED Operation Mode Indicators

LED light easily allows the user to distinguish the current system status. For example **REC** LED: The LED indicator lit indicates recording, and when unlit indicates no recording (REC LED flashes when the power supply is insufficient).

#### (6) **Button**

Buttons commonly used:  $\text{Rec} \square / \bullet$ . But all other 5 buttons are applied during setups. Every button under each mode has different definition. For more details, please refer to the section on "Function Description Table".

#### (7) **LED Power Indicator**

The LED indicator lit indicates that the device is powered up and when unlit indicates that the power is insufficient or switched off.

#### **Function Description Table**

Please read the "Function Description Table" carefully before operation, to enable quick understanding of the relations between the button and mode.


The LED indictor (on the front panel) represents the current mode or screen display status. Under different mode each function has different meanings. The **Function Description Table** clearly lists the LED light as it appears during different mode and its corresponding relations with the function buttons. The system is mainly divided into stop mode, record mode, playback mode, setup menu mode, and etc. These modes will be discussed on the later section.

#### Power On

- 1. The power switch is situated on the right side of the device.
  - NOTE: Each time after power-on, the system auto-detects its peripherals. When the REC LED flashes indicate that the system memory is proceeding testing (complete boot time is several seconds). When an image file error has been detected, the system will initiate auto repair.
- 2. After power on, the system auto enters live monitoring. When the system is currently under schedule recording, it auto enters record mode.
- 3. "• icon shown on the status line, indicates that the system memory is operating normally.
- 4. When problem occurs to the system memory. Press record or playback, the corresponding LED indicator will not lit. Play, Menu, and Rec indicator will flash quickly. Please re-format before proceeding.
- 5. When system memory is writing data during recording, record indicator will flash slowly.
- 6. After power-loss the system auto returns to the previous recording mode.

#### 6.2 Monitoring Mode

- 1 The monitoring mode is displayed according to the pre-setup (system setup after power-on), and the user may view live monitoring.
  - ① **Time Display:** System Date and Time.



- ② Record Status Display: Manual Record Parameter.

#### **③** System Memory Status:

### 6.3 Record Mode

- 1. Start Record: 3 Types of recording mode.
  - Manual Record: Suitable to record at anytime. Press 《Rec ■/●》 button, to enter manual recording status (start recording). For more information, please refer to 【7.4 Record Setup】.
  - (2) Motion Detection Record: Suitable to record, when there are severe image changes. Motion detection triggers schedule recording, but it will only start recording when the variation exceeds the alarm limitation value. For more information, please refer to [7.3 Record setup] and [7.4 Record Setup].
  - (3) Continuous Record: Suitable on few constant frame recording or on long-term continuous recording. For more information, please refer to [7.4 Record Setup]. Please refer to the
- 2. Stop Record:

Press  $(\text{Rec} / \bullet)$  button, stops manual recording only. Enter (Play + ||) or (Menu) schedule recording (Motion Detection and Continuous Record), all kinds of recordings will be stopped. To continue recording, please follow the methods below to restart recording.

- 4. The event status is determined by the system recording, according to the order of priority. The order of priority: Manual Record, Motion Detection and then Schedule Record.
- 5. Different recording modes may have different kinds of setups. Basic setup: video size, recording frames, video quality, and audio recording. When different recording modes are triggered, the system starts recording according to the different setup. This kind of design provides flexibility to ensure efficient recording time and quality. Example: Work hour from 8:00am to 6:00pm, setup 「Schedule Record」 to low video quality with less recording frames to extend the recording time. And off work hour, setup 「Motion Detection Record」 to enable high video quality with the highest recording frames, when an event occurs.

- 6. Video may be recorded to the system memory. When the video has been stored, the REC LED flashes indicate that the system is currently loading the file to the system memory.
- 7. No matter which record mode is used, please enter the main menu (Refer to 7.1 Main Menu) and then switch off the power.




 $\triangle$  Power loss during recording results incomplete videos or errors.

### 6.4 Playback Mode

1 Selectable Playback format: Continuous Playback and Searching Playback.


(1) Normal Playback: Press 《Play > II》 button to playback according to the system memory file order.



- : Normal speed playback. Press 《Play > II》 again to pause playback.
- : During normal playback, press ( ( ) or ( ) button to fast 4 Þ forward or rewind (Speed:  $x^2/x^4/x^8/x^{16}/x^{32}$ ). Press (Play  $\rightarrow$  II) button to return to normal playback.
- : During playback, press 《Play > II》 button to pause playback and press Ш again to return to pl ' ': statur
- : During pause, press « 4 / 4 » or « > / > button to step forward one frame and step rewind I-frame. Press 《Play ▶ Ⅱ》 button to return to normal speed playback.

Press  $\langle\!\langle \text{Rec} \blacksquare / \bullet \rangle\!\rangle$  button to stop playback function and to return to live status.


(2) Search and Playback: Enter MENU and select [SEARCH AND PLAY] item.



- . ① File directory shows dates and the amount of contents under the directory. The user may press 《 ♠ 》 《 ♥ 》 button to move the cursor up or down.
- <sup>(2)</sup> Current location page.
- ④ Displays the time highlighted by the event bar.
- Blue: Manual Record / Red: Motion Detection Record / White: Schedule Record .
- NOTE: Select the desired playback starting time, press《MENU》and《-》《+》, select 《PLAY》, and then press 《MENU》 again to start playback.
- NOTE: Press 《Rec ■/● 》 button to stop playback and the system will return to [SEARCH and PLAY] selection and enables the user to select the prefered input source.
- NOTE: Press  $\langle \rangle \langle + \rangle$ , select  $\langle EXIT \rangle$  and then press  $\langle MENU \rangle$  again to return to main menu.

### 7.1 Main Menu



Press  $\langle A \rangle$  or  $\langle V \rangle$  button, to move the highlight-bar and the cursor ( $\triangleright$ ). Press  $\langle + \rangle$  button, to enter the sub menu (>). Press  $\langle MENU/EXIT \rangle$  button:

- Under second or third menu layer, the system will return to the previous menu layer (second layer to first layer or third layer to second layer).
- Under main menu (first menu layer), the system will enter live mode.
  Press 《 ◀ 》 or 《 ▶ 》 button, to increase or decrease the setting values that has been highlighted.



1. MANUAL RECORD: Press (Rec  $\blacksquare / \bullet$ ) button to start recording.




